#### 2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC

- IQAC plays an active role in internalising an ethnicity of quality in the institution through various activities. Orientation Programmes were organized at the beginning of the academic year for the teaching, supporting staff and students by academic experts from reputed colleges.
- 2. Organized a NAAC sponsored Two-Day National Seminar on Academic and Administrative Audit and number of workshops to enhance the quality of teaching, learning and research.
- 3. Periodical meetings/ discussions with the Head of the departments and the members of IQAC were conducted to collate the data pertaining to various activities of the departments and committees. The IQAC members along with Coordinator visited the departments once in two months to monitor the activities.
- 4. Numbers of meetings were held with the Head of the departments and the Controller of Examinations and Academic Council members on the need for institutional excellence, curriculum restructuring based on UGC CBCS, and exam reforms and credits.
- 5. The Student Council meets periodically to plan activities that could enhance the quality of student life on campus.
- 6. IQAC encouraged the staff to pursue research and four of them were selected to do M.Phil & Ph.D under FDP UGC XII Plan period, **two of** them were awarded Ph.D, **ten of** them were registered for Ph.D. and eleven of our staffs are doing Minor Research Projects and students study projects also given a lot of emphasize.
- 7. Feedback on teachers' performance, Management Administration was taken from students and other stakeholders like parents, alumnae to assess the quality of teaching and learning specially to analyze the outcome of teaching and administration. Annual feedback was also done by Final Degree students on overall performance of the college. Suggestions were given for the better outcome and for quality enhancement of the institution.
- 8. Preparatory meeting for Academic Audit was done. Academic Audit Team was appointed by CCE, Hyderabad visited the departments and assessed the activities, teaching learning methods, progress of the institution, staff and students and the College was awarded with A Grade. They also gave a few suggestions for the further development.
- Encouraged the departments to conduct Learn to Teach & Teach to learn programme to
  provide teaching experience to our students and to equip the school students with better
  knowledge.

- 10. Strengthened the linkages with other Institutions and Industries.
- 11. **Earn While Learn Programme** was encouraged to enable the students to meet their own little needs by preparing Sprouts, surf, phenol, flower bouquets, candles etc. They also visited nearby villages and taught the ladies to prepare the same and use it for their needs. This programme imparted Community Service experience to the students and they learned to meet the community needs.

#### **Goals/Objectives:**

So, service learning engage the students to be active, collaborative, and inquiry-based learning experiences that meet the community needs.

#### **Practice:**

- The Management along with staff and students adopted Sajjanapet, Angalakuduru village and trained 36 ladies in tailoring from 2 to 4 P.M. from 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2015 to March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2016. The departments of Chemistry, Home Science, Languages and Humanities trained them to prepare surf, Pain Balm and Candle Making after the college hours. The valedictory function was on 21<sup>st</sup> March, 2016. The ladies expressed their joy and gratitude to the Management and staff for helping them to be self employed. Ms.U.Bhavani, the Village Sarpanch, Angalakuduru who was present for the event appreciated the Management for the initiative taken.
- NSS volunteers participated in the Tree Plantation Drive organized by Sri.Alapati Rejendra Prasad, MLA, Tenali in nearby villages on 25<sup>th</sup> November, 2015. The students planted nearly 800 saplings in different villages.
- ➤ Free Eye Medical Camp was organized in collaboration with Sankar Eye Hospital, Guntur at Katevaram village, Tenali from 12<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> March, 2016. Number of village people benefited from the camp.

- ➤ Departments visited Old Age Homes in and around Tenali and distributed fruits and sweets to inculcate Social concisousness among students.
- > Staff and Students sponsored Cash and materials to the Little Sisters of the Poor, Nambur.
- ➤ Management along with Staff and students contributed Rs.23, 000 for the flood victims of Chennai.
- ➤ Management & Staff participated in the construction of Nvayandhra Capital Amaravathi Rs.8, 500 for "My Brick My Amaravathi".
- ➤ The Department of Mathematics and Statistics motivated the students during Communal Harmony Week from 19-25th November and they contributed Rs.3,500/- which was sent to Secretary National Foundation for Communal Harmony and also Rs. 3,500/- to Zilla Sainik welfare Association Guntur.
- ➤ Organised Sales Mela on 28th November, 2015 and Rs.35,000 is contributed to educate the Tribal children at Kondramutla.
- ➤ The staff and students of Dept. of Mathematics interacted with the inmates of SWADHAR Home who are affected with HIV/AIDS, trafficked and orphans on 9<sup>th</sup> October, 2015. They donated CD Player, Dinner Set and distributed fruits, sweets and showed their concern and love.
- > Students were trained to prepare pain balm, surf and phenol and they sold them to students and staff. The collection was contributed for the education of the poor girls of our college.

#### **Evidence of Success:**

- > Staff and students enhanced their social skills and commitment to meet the needs of the community
- ➤ Ready to share and show concern for the poor, aged, sick and natural calamity victims whenever necessary
- > Students sense of responsibility and societal effectiveness have increased

### Problems encountered and Resources Required:

- Motivating the staff and students to do community service and to extend financial support is a hard task.
- Some of the students did not cooperate but the Management made it compulsory.

#### **BEST PRACTICE - II**

### **Enhancing the art of Communicative Skills in English**

#### **Goals/Objectives:**

- To enable the students to communicate effectively in real situations
- > To enhance their self confidence and to perform better in academic

#### **Context:**

The students were the first generation learners with Telugu Medium background. They were finding it difficult to express their views and ideas in English. They feel shy to speak in English and fear of making mistakes make them not to use English language even where it is necessary. A few girls are from English medium and they too are tent to speak in Telugu gradually. Therefore, in order to improve the situation, the Management arranged Communicative English classes for all the students.

#### **Practice:**

Communicative English Skills classes were arranged for the entire students to enhance their speaking skills and self confidence from July 2015 to March 2016 by Institute of Language Management, Bangalore. The classes were arranged class wise during college hour and after and before college hour. Ms.S. Padmalatha, the Institute of Language Management (ILM) faculty was taking classes regularly and maintained the attendance. The students improved their fluency in English and they learned various skills like Drama, English Songs, Skits, storytelling, role plays, debating skills, elocution, language games etc. They expressed their interest to continue the programme. Communicative English classes conducted by ILM faculty were effective as the students are speaking in English interestingly without any inhibitions.

#### **Evidence of Success:**

- Developed fluency and self confidence
- Enhanced speaking skills to communicate with others effectively
- ➤ Improved the result of General English

### **Problems encountered and Resources Required:**

Some of the students did not show any interest in learning English in spite of taking a lot effort by the Management and the ILM teacher. The management took measures to strengthen this programme by requesting the ILM to appoint two faculties to take the Communicative English classes with more activities.
