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2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.		<p>The Covid-19 pandemic showed its impact on all the sectors of livelihood. Due to the sudden lockdown, students were not able to attend the physical classes. It disrupted teaching and learning process in all the Educational Institutions at all levels. Electronic learning (e-learning) or online education became the alternative or core method of teaching to make the students to learn and to maintain academic standards as well as preparing them to face the examinations. The use of a Desktop, Laptop, and Smart phones and the internet forms a major component of this Teaching learning process.</p> <p>We have taken many measures during the pandemic period to take regular classes and to bring out the best in the students. The staff prepared a schedule for each class and followed the same while connecting the students for teaching and learning. They adopted various online learning platforms and tools like Google Meet, Google Classroom, Zoom, Google Duo, Whatsapp, GMail etc. according to the convenience of the students. The Principal was monitoring the classes and encouraged the students to attend the online classes regularly and the details of the classes were posted in the Portal of Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Andhra Pradesh. The needed information like notes, PPTs and videos were posted as the students could not utilize library physically for the further reference.</p> <p>As some of the students were unable to access the internet without interruption, the recorded contents and videos helped the students to compensate the absence of classes. The staff also availed themselves to students to clarify their doubts. Quizzes and simple tests were administered to the students through Google Form and other online tools to monitor their learning pace and took remedial measures to help the slow learners. It improved the self-study skills in the students and students were virtually connected and cleared their doubts time to time. Though using technology and other online tools for teaching and learning was tough at the beginning to reach out the students due to technical issues, the staff managed and motivated the students to respond to the classes and that helped the staff to carry out the online classes regularly and completed the syllabus without leaving a minute part. And each Department conducted online Certificate Courses other than prescribed syllabus.
